## **Completion Work Will Bring Lane Restrictions to Waddle Road**

**State College, PA** – The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) is alerting motorists to some short-term lane restrictions coming soon on Waddle Road.

May 14 through 18, crews will be working to finish applying an epoxy surface treatment to the bridge deck and approaches on Waddle Road. The bridge spans I-99/Route 322 at the Toftrees interchange, near State College.

Restrictions will be in place around the clock during those 5 days, with traffic restricted to a single lane northbound and a single lane southbound across the bridge. Additionally, northbound Waddle Road will be restricted from Oakwood Avenue to the I-99 southbound off-ramp and southbound Waddle Road will be restricted from Toftrees Avenue to the I-99 northbound off-ramp. All work is weather and schedule dependent.

If progress allows for completion prior to Friday, PennDOT will remove the lane restrictions early.

The overall project began in 2016 and featured improvements including a new wider Waddle Road bridge, addition of a turn lane on the Route 322 westbound off-ramp, addition of turning lanes at the Colonnade Boulevard/Waddle Road intersection, addition of bike lanes on Waddle Road from Colonnade Boulevard to Toftrees Avenue, Waddle Road signal upgrades at Route 322 off-ramps and Colonnade Boulevard intersection, and roadway widening on Waddle Road from Strouse Avenue to Toftrees Avenue.

This design/build project completed in 2017, with the remaining epoxy treatment work scheduled for this year. Glenn O. Hawbaker, Inc. of State College was the contractor on this \$14.7 million job.
